Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller presented this handwritten note to Pamela Hadas during the hearing of Case #04C1779 in Boulder Court.

Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller had stolen all of Dr. Hadas' property records, tax forms, book manuscripts, bank records and everything related to her financial affairs after unlawfully committing her to in-patient alcohol treatment at Harmony House in Estes Park.

Although Dr. Hadas was not an alcoholic and was soon so determined by the treatment facility, Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller proceeded to contact her employer to inform the University that she would not be teaching any longer.

Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller then unlawfully accessed her bank account and removed the last of Dr. Hadas' funds.

Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller then attempted to rent out Dr. Hadas' house to his associate Walter Eugene Barrett.

When Harmony House realized that Dr. Hadas was not an alcoholic, Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller arranged to have her committed to Burning Tree Insane Asylum in Texas, claiming that she had borderline personality disorder.

It was painfully apparent that Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller, Judith Phillips and Walter Eugene Barrett planned to usurp Dr. Hadas' estate and retirement investments in addition to the \$120,000 they had already stolen from her.

When Dr. Hadas was released from Harmony House and discovered that her bank account had been depleted and all of her personal and financial records had been removed from her home, she confronted Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller and asked for the return of her property.

Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller denied having her property, but admitted having stolen the money from her.

Almost a year later, Attorney Thomas Cecil "Doc" Miller finally admits that he has Dr. Hadas' financial records and offers to return them.
