RE: Petition for Redress of Grievance / Notice of Fault

Dear Mr. Gartin:

On or about October 10, 2000 I received a document from you captioned "Petition for Redress of Grievance in the nature of a Private International Administrative Remedy Demand", hereafter ("The Petition"). I am aware that Investigator Don Estep, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, also received such a document, and that they each named him and me as individual "Respondents". The Petition seemed to request that I submit answers to many statements submitted by you, regarding an ongoing criminal investigation by this Agency, of which you are a subject. I have absolutely no legal obligation to respond to such a document.

Subsequently, you mailed a second and related document, captioned "Notice of Fault - Opportunity to Cure", (hereafter "The Notice"), received on or about October 16, 2000. That document states alleged "Statement(s) of Fact", based upon my (and presumably Investigator Estep's) failure to respond to The Petition. This correspondence is to notify you that I do not agree that you have presented any valid claim in a forum or manner which requires an answer from me, Investigator Estep, or our respective Agencies. If you choose to pursue this avenue, with the intended result being the filing of any sort of Lis Pendens, liens, or any other such claims or encumbrances against the property belonging to me or Investigator Estep, you may be committing violations of the Colorado Criminal Code, for which you will be subject to criminal prosecution.

If you feel that there have been inappropriate actions regarding your arrest or subsequent search warrants in the instant case, you may raise those issues with the criminal court after charges against you have been filed, and/or you may seek appropriate civil remedies in State or Federal courts.
